 - (f) Why does William Hazlitt think that nicknames govern the world?
 - (g) What happens when Pan stamps his feet?
 - (h) Who was the first Asian recipient of Nobel Prize in Literature?

- (a) Discuss after Johnson the different disguises with which idleness seeks to cover itself.
- (b) Comment on Charles Lamb's application of the elements of humour and pathos in his essay, *Dream Children*: A Reverie.

- (c) Discuss how Gandhi refutes the allegations of Tagore against Non-Cooperation Movement.
- (d) Do you think Chesterton's essay, On Lying in Bed is a commendation of the practice of lying in bed? Give a reasoned answer.
- (e) How, according to Russell, can psychoanalysis be useful in the cultivation of rationalism?
- (f) How does Russell define rationality? Discuss the two aspects of rationalism as expressed by Russell in the essay, Can Man be Rational?
- 4. Explain, with reference to the context, any three of the following: 5×3=15
 - (a) I could not but observe with a great deal of pleasure, the joy that appeared in the countenances of these ancient domestics upon my friend's arrival at his country-seat.
 - (b) Idleness is a silent and peaceful quality, that neither raises envy by ostentation, nor hatred by opposition; and therefore nobody is busy to censure or detect it.
 - (c) Nicknames are the convenient, portable tools by which they simplify the process of mischief, and get through their job with the least time and trouble.

- (d) This power of good must prove its truth and strength by its fearlessness, by its refusal to accept any imposition which depends for its success upon its power to produce frightfulness and is not ashamed to use its machines of destruction to terrorise a population completely disarmed.
- (e) The nation's non-cooperation is an invitation to the Government to cooperate with it on its own terms as is every nation's right and every good government's duty.
- (f) A man is rational in proportion as his intelligence informs and controls his desires.
